We have had a great start to the year so far. Students and teachers are busy with new lessons and assignments, and coaches for girls basketball and boys volleyball have started team practices. It is good to be back!

At the opening assembly, we were delighted to have a number of you join us to celebrate this new beginning.

We heard from the new student council, and the student prayer team led us in prayer for the different aspects of the school community. Our board chair, Mr. Andre DeVries, brought us greetings from the Board and shared a word with the students about the blessings of being able to attend a Christian high school. Policy Corner

This year we are making a shift in direction as a school. If we are serious about learning, then I believe the way students use their spares is an important part of their learning. Spares are meant to be non-instructional learning periods. The emphasis is on learning rather than on free time.

Because most of the students on spare are Grade 12 students, they will soon be heading off to post secondary education.

I believe our job as a school is to prepare our students to be successful in college and university. The drop out rate in colleges is high. Having a spare is often the students' first taste of having time at school that they get to manage. Over the past few of years, I have become more and more convinced that we need to encourage students to make good use of their spares.

The intent of a spare is to provide time for students to work on homework and large assignments such as independent study units (ISUs).

Students over the years have complained about having too much homework in Grade 12. There may be a number of reasons for this, but one major problem is the management problem. If they don't use their time along the way and allow things to pile up, they can quickly feel overwhelmed.

Getting fit involves making many small choices to eat well and exercise. For instance, this summer I worked up to running 5k three times per week. I didn't suddenly get fit in one long night of exercise! In the same way, no one loses weight by starving oneself for 24 hours! I've tried it! **You reach your goal by making good decisions over and over again.**

Because time in general is our most precious resource, I am encouraging our senior students, who find themselves with too much free time, to consider using their spares in other constructive ways, such as going to the gym, doing a part time job, or getting involved in a volunteer opportunity.

SPARE POLICY

To have a spare is a privilege and therefore carries some responsibilities. When students are not in class, it is extremely important that they do not interfere with the learning of other students in the school. To help avoid disruptions to other classes the following guidelines are to be observed by students on spare.

1. Students may use the Grade 12 Study Room as a place of reading or study.
2. The cafeteria is open and should be the primary place for students with a spare.
3. The halls and front foyer are not places for them to be during your spare.
4. If students must be in the hall, to get from one place to another, they are to remain quiet. They are in no way allowed to disrupt a class or distract any students within the class.
5. If there is no class in the gym, and a gym permission form has been filed with the office, the gym is available for student use. Students must provide their own equipment.
6. Students on spare, must attend all-school activities, e.g. special events, activities, assemblies etc...even if during a spare.
7. Students **MUST SIGN OUT** when leaving school property and **SIGN IN** at the office when they return. Students who have a 1st period must sign in at the office when they arrive at school.
8. Fire drill: form an spare attendance line.
9. Lock down: depending where they are, students go to a place with an adult.

Lockdown

The school has a lockdown policy and procedure. We will be conducting lockdown drills again this year.

Transportation

On behalf of Montgomery bus company, we would like to remind students and parents of the following:

Only certain items are permitted on the bus.

- skateboards, roller blades and ice skates are permitted if they are in backpacks and are completely covered (plastic grocery bags are not acceptable); ice skates must have skate guards;

- musical instruments are permitted and must be kept on the student's lap;

- cell phones and 'gameboys' are permitted as long as they are not a distraction to the driver or other students: bus drivers have the right to disallow them at their discretion;

- students need to be at their bus pick-up points at least **5 minutes early** - bus drivers are instructed not to wait for students who are late - this slows down the whole bus route, and causes buses to be late for school.

The 2010/2011 Student Council is looking forward to the year ahead.

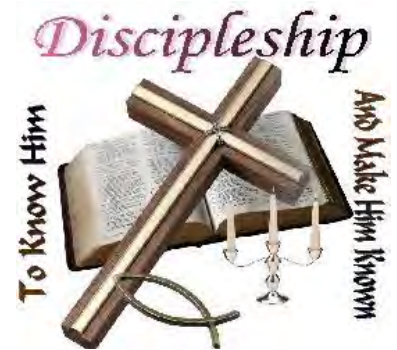
The Student Council Executive met for a retreat in August at a cottage near Kingston to discuss plans for the year.

For example, Loyalist College provides \$2,000 for students with a combined average of 85% for their grade 11 and 12 credits. The Quinte Christian High School tradition of the senior trip to the Stratford Festival continues this year.

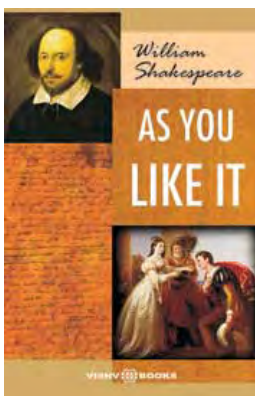
The Grade 11 and 12 classes will see *As You Like It* on October 12. The cost for the day is \$65 which includes transportation (coach bus) and a theatre ticket.

There is an athletics link, as well as a calendar link (on which games and practices will be posted) on the school website www.qchs.ca. The Athletic Council has set a goal this year to keep the information on the site up to date.

Throughout the season our school participates in two different leagues and at a number of different schools. The local league in which we participate is the Bay of Quinte, which is part of Central Ontario Secondary School Athletics (COSSA), one of a number of regions which make up the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Association (OFSAA). We also participate in the Ontario Christian Secondary School Athletic Association (OCSSAA) which is made up of 19 Christian High Schools in Ontario. The Bay of Quinte schools are: In Belleville, Centennial Secondary School (CSS) Nicholson Catholic College (NCC) Quinte Secondary School (QSS) Moira Secondary School (MSS) and St Theresa Secondary School (STSS). In Quinte West, Bayside Secondary School (BSS), Escole Marc Garneau (ESMG) by the Trenton Air Base, Trenton High School (THS), and St Paul Secondary School (SPSS). The other schools are Picton Educational Collegiate Institute (PECI), East Northumberland Secondary School (ENSS) in Brighton, North Addington Educational Centre (NAEC) in Cloyne, Centre Hastings Secondary School (CHSS) in Madoc and North Hastings High School (NHHS) in Bancroft.

Our school will be the host site for two major volleyball tournaments this fall. The provincial Catholic School boys tournament Oct 15, 16 and OCSSAA boys on Nov 5, 6. We are also the host school for OFSAA girls volleyball in March of 2011.

Fall sports teams

This year we two girls basketball teams. The juniors are coached by Mrs. Serviss and Mr. VanderWindt is coaching the seniors. The juniors have already participated in 3 games and have been improving with each game, but have not yet come up with their first win of the season.
